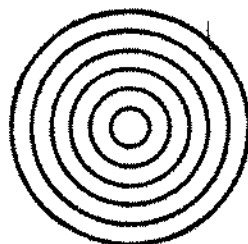

RESOLUTION 138

Status of the Treaty and its Additional Protocols
Saint Vincent and the Grenadines

The General Conference,

Bearing in mind that Saint Vincent and the Grenadines have proclaimed their independence and have become a new sovereign State located on the American Continent within the zone of application of the Treaty of Tlatelolco;

Recalling its Resolutions 46 (III), 80 (IV) and 119 (VI);

Observing that the territory of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines was included in the Statute for military de-nuclearization established by the Treaty through the commitment of Great Britain in the Additional Protocol I to the Treaty and that, when Saint Vincent and the Grenadines reached independence, said Statute is no longer applicable to this new State;

Considering that, under the terms of Article 25, the Treaty is open to the signature of new sovereign States when admitted by the General Conference,

- - -

Resolves:

1. To invite the Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, in compliance with its wish, to become a State Party to the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America and Member of OPANAL at an early date.

2. To request the Secretary General to transmit the text of the present resolution to the honourable Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, offering its maximum co-operation.
