RESOLUTION CG/RES. 410
STATUS OF THE TREATY AND ITS ADDITIONAL PROTOCOLS

The General Conference,

Taking note with satisfaction of the total adherence to the purposes and principles of the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America and the Caribbean (Treaty of Tlatelolco) by all the Member States and Linked States to it;

Bearing in mind Resolutions 267 (E-V), 268 (XII) and 290 (E-VII) which approved a group of amendments to the Treaty of Tlatelolco aimed at reaching the full entry into force of the Treaty;

Recalling Resolution A/Res./55/39 of the United Nations General Assembly of January 5, 2001, which in its Resolutive paragraph 1 “Welcomes the concrete steps taken by some countries of the region during the past year for the consolidation of the regime of military denuclearization established by the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America and the Caribbean (Treaty of Tlatelolco)” and in Resolutive paragraph 2 “Urges the countries of the region that have not yet done so to deposit their instruments of ratification of the amendments to the Treaty of Tlatelolco approved by the General Conference....”

Recalling also Resolution AG/Res.1798 (XXXI/0/01) of June 5, 2001 of the Organization of American States which Resolutive paragraph 1 reads: “To urge the States of the region that have not yet done so to deposit their instruments of ratification of the Treaty of Tlatelolco, as well as the amendments approved by the General Conference of the Agency for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America and the Caribbean (OPANAL)...”; in Resolutive paragraph 2 it states:

“To reaffirm the importance of strengthening the Agency for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America and the Caribbean (OPANAL) as the appropriate legal and political forum for ensuring unqualified observance of the Treaty in its zone of application and cooperation with the agencies of other nuclear weapon free zones...”

Being aware of the importance for Cuba to ratify the Treaty of Tlatelolco to achieve total adherence;

Having considered the Report of the Good Offices Committee (Doc.CG/529);

Taking into consideration the reply contained in the Note of June 6, 2000 from the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Cuba, H.E. Mr. Felipe Pérez Roque,

Resolves:

1. **To express its satisfaction** that the amended Treaty of Tlatelolco is fully in force for Argentina, Barbados, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Guyana, Jamaica, Mexico, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Suriname, Uruguay and Venezuela.
2. **To exhort** all State Parties that have not signed and/or ratified the amendments to it adopted by the General Conference in Resolutions 267 (E-V), 268 (XII) and 290 (E-VII) to take steps to do so as soon as possible in order to achieve the full entry into force of the Treaty.
3. **To thank** for the Report of the Good Offices Committee contained in document CG/529.
4. **To make a respectful call** to the Republic of Cuba to conclude the adherence process to the Treaty of Tlatelolco by depositing the corresponding instrument of ratification.
