RESOLUTION CG/RES. 415
USE OF NUCLEAR ENERGY FOR PEACEFUL PURPOSES

The General Conference,

Considering that the Treaty of Tlatelolco grants limited authority to OPANAL to address certain issues of current international importance,

Considering also Resolution 368 (E-XII) which instructed the Council to study the actions resulting from the Ad-Hoc Working Group on the Strengthening of OPANAL that require a process of amendments to the Treaty until a definitive decision is made;

Having examined the Memorandum of the Secretary General, document CG/534,

Resolves:

1. **To make a call** to all the State Parties of the Treaty of Tlatelolco to send to the Secretary General their official position regarding the issue of the Use of Nuclear Energy for Peaceful Purposes, so that they, together with the Council, continue the study, in an attempt to find the necessary consensus on this issue.
2. **To entrust** the Secretariat General that the results of the study be presented to the next General Conference.
